There is much here to argue about as far as the details. As an overview of the turbulences it does a good job. David Drake gets the short end of the stick but his own words are a better rebuttal of the theories about him.

[*Depressing. Eric Raymond is mistaken when it comes to left/right and libertarianism. He believes that "[identifying] libertarianism as a right-wing phenomenon [...] is an error characteristic of left-leaning thinkers, who tend to assume that anything not 'left' is 'right' and that approving of free markets somehow implies social conservatism."* This is incorrect. We know that libertarians are not social conservatives. The distinction is between those who want everyone to be OK and those who don't. On this spectrum libertarians are to the right. I also find it unacceptable that the good parts of SF—such as “the affirmation that the universe has a knowable order that is discoverable through reason and science”—are intrinsically bound to libertarianism. Are all scientists right-wing? It sounds like “radical hard SF” has the right idea: keep the “sense of wonder” and remove the libertarianism.

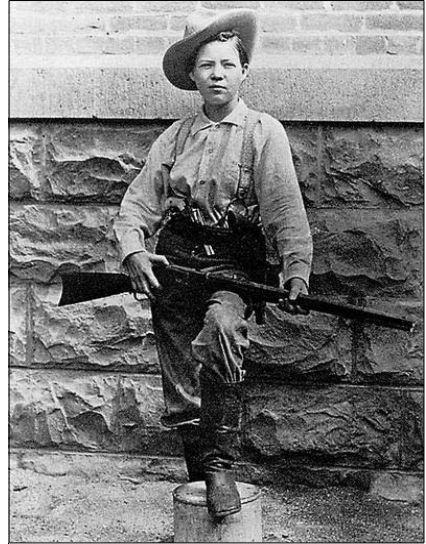

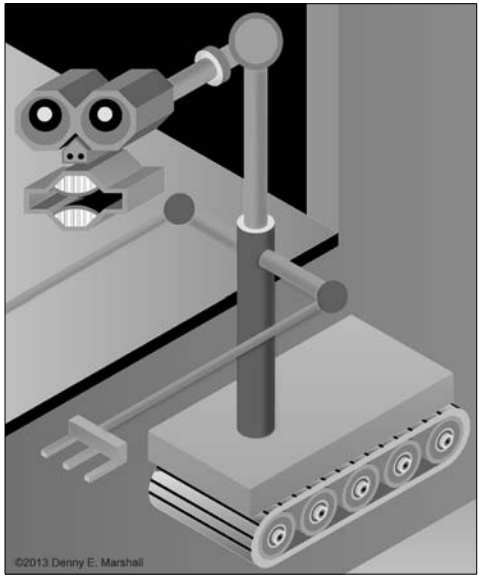

Fruvous saw a documentary by CGP Grey about power: you have to pay off the people under you, and in a dictatorship it's a smaller number than in a democracy.

Ray said that under Trump, PBS is toast. They'll lose 60% of their funding.

Graeme said that whereas Trump said he would believe the election results if he won, by contrast Nixon conceded because he didn't want to tear the country apart even though he was sure Kennedy stole the election with the "cemetery vote." Graeme added that Haig said "I'm in charge" to reassure the country that they knew what they were doing, and that Kissinger was stuck in the 19th century Metternich mode of global politics as chess.

Topic: China. Is it becoming more democratic as it becomes capitalist? We disagreed on the answer. Graeme said "I firmly believe the Communists are still in charge and have learned to exploit capitalism for their own ends. Don't mistake permitted consumerism for democracy." Graeme does not see any positive future in his lifetime: Russia/Putin too powerful; Europe (especially Baltics) freaking out; Canada, they look to as more stable; Trump in US; various European countries stepping backwards to far-right-wing politics.

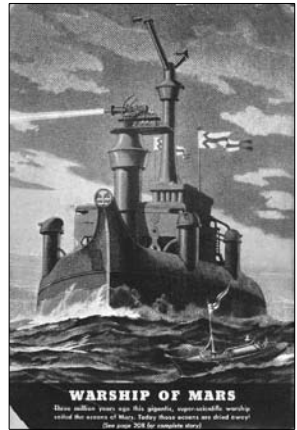

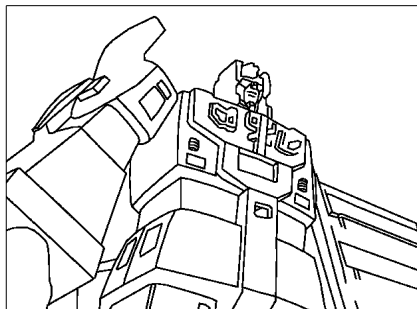

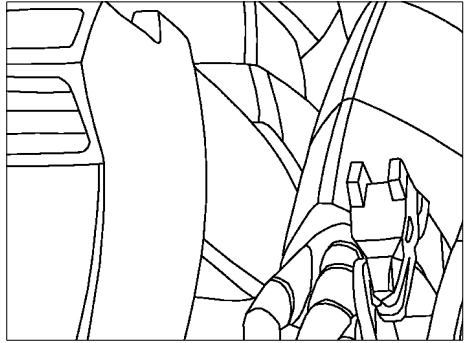

Review: ‘The Secret Number,’ by Igor Teper

“The Secret Number” is a short sci-fi story by Igor Tepek I came across on the Strange Horizons website.

The basic idea is that a crazed mathematician has been confined to a mental hospital because he insists that there is a missing integer, a number between three and four named “bleem.”

I like the silly ideas and very non-serious writing style. It reminds me of some of Theodore Sturgeon’s sillier stories, and that’s high praise from me. The goofy, manic energy of the story is well suited to its short length and makes for a fun ride.

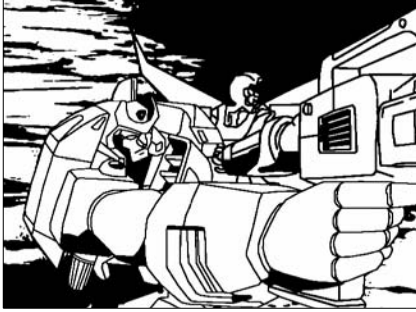
But the thing is, when you have a very short story with such a high level of energy, you really have to slam that ending and hit it out of the park, and this story barely bunts.

A story like this is more or less a joke in terms of structure. It has a premise, a buildup, and a punchline. The more energy there is in that buildup, the bigger a surprise and a laugh that punchline has to be. But the punchline, as it were, to this story was weak and extremely predictable. It’s pretty much the exact same punchline to a whole raft of sci-fi stories about a crazy-sounding person who turns out to be right.

And if the punchline doesn’t work in a story this short, there’s not much else to give it merit or weight. That’s why the short story is such a difficult form, and the

shorter the story, the harder it is. Everything has to be seamless and perfect, with exactly the right amount of payoff, or the reader is left going “That’s it?”

And I know one shouldn’t nitpick the logic of a silly, jokey story like this one, but I can’t help it. The premise doesn’t make sense. Call the number after three



whatever you like, but it’s still four, mathematically speaking. The illustration with the jelly beans shows that. There’s absurd and then there’s absurd, and I realize drawing the line between “enjoyably goofy” and “stupid” is a fairly subjective judgment call, but still, to me, the premise fails the basic logic test.

So on a scale of one to ten, I’m afraid I can only give this story a bleem.5 at most.
