Just Rambling About Death...That's All

It has been a rough 6 months. Three of my friends have killed themselves.

My roommate from the army was found dead two weeks ago. He was a good guy. Played a lot of video games and liked to draw.

I think we all saw it coming. He had a bad life after the army. Kevin got into a car accident right when he finished serving. Totaled his truck. His wife at the time had been looking for a reason to screw him over. She wasn't the best person. So she used the accident as a springboard to take his kids from him. She won in court and Kevin began the process of drinking himself to death.

Lord, did he drink. I would check up on him every week or so and each time he would tell me he was "about a fifth of the way through a handle of wild turkey."

I don't even know what unit of measurement a handle is.

Kevin's best friend Donnie died in Afghanistan in 2011. Donnie started out in our unit and he was another great kid that was a good soldier. It broke Kevin pretty bad. After that, he told me that I, "was his new best friend because Donnie is gone."

My friend Kevin deserved VA benefits, but he waited so long to get them. He was practically living on the streets when I finally got him to go down and begin the long process of getting benefits.

Two days before he died, he messaged me.

He was telling me how he was feeling down. We were coming up on the anniversary of Donnie's death and this sort of thing happened every year. "Shit's getting dark here," were his exact words. I thought I talked him down. We started laughing and joking. We chatted most of the night. I kept telling him to just jump on a train and come see me. By the end of the night he had decided to go live with my old team leader,

Brian. I was pretty happy about this. Brian was an excellent soldier and he would help keep Kevin on the straight and narrow.

I thought we had a handle on it.

I still don't know what unit of measurement a handle is.

Kevin messaged me the day after that at 2 a.m. (having gone through my facebook pictures) and he was telling me how lucky I was that I met Max Brooks. I woke up at 7 a.m. and replied with laughter.

Kevin was found dead shortly after that of a drug overdose. We don't know if it was intentional or accidental. He didn't leave a note. I can't help but think that I should have known that this time was different.

It's so hard not to take it personally. I wish I could have done something else, said something better or just decided to jump on a train and drag my friend away from his life. Somehow that would change his timeline and he'd still be here today.

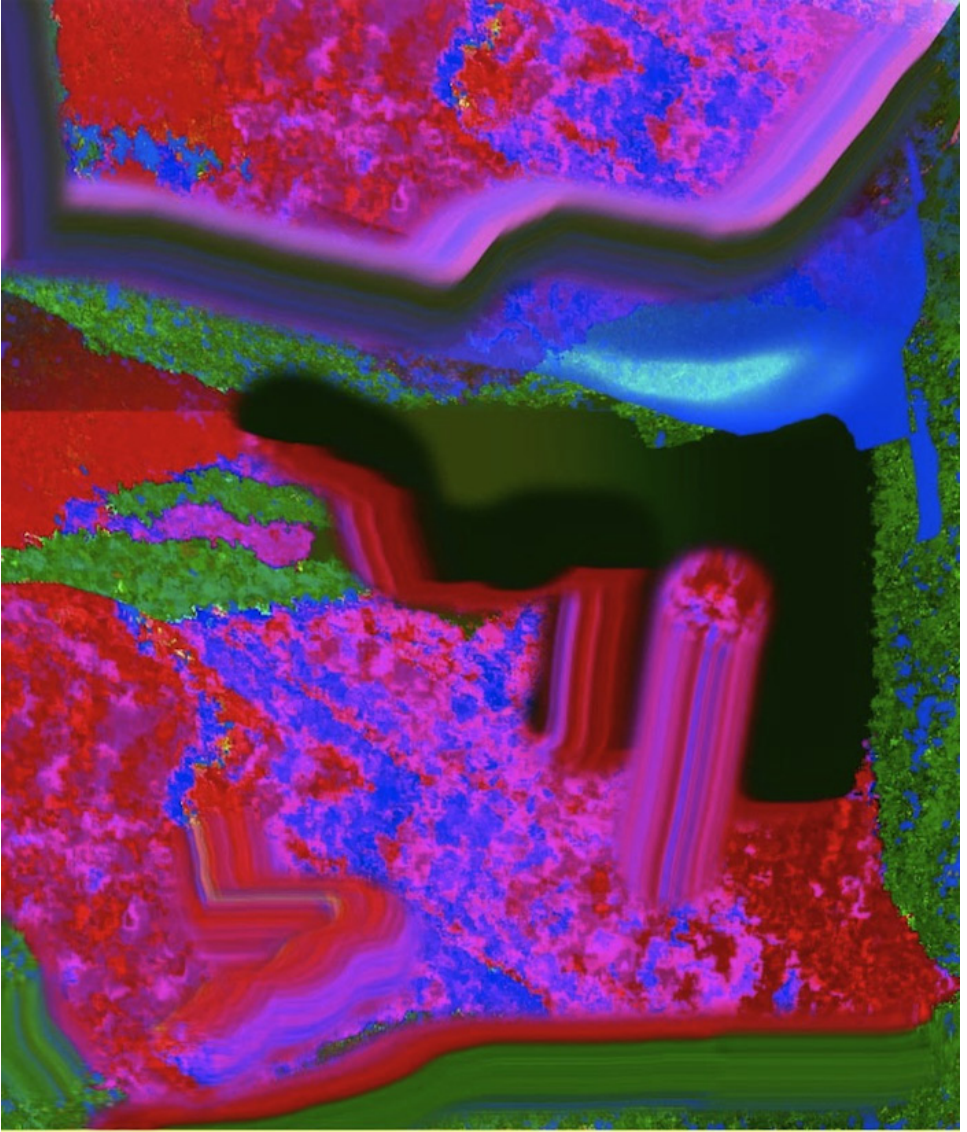
That's just the demons of survivor's guilt clawing at the inside of my skull, screaming to be set free. Their long sharp fangs and toothy grins keep me up most nights. Every time one of my army buddies dies, the demons grow in size and get sharper edges. I wish I knew a way to remove these monsters from my life.

I keep thinking I can just message Kevin and bullshit about random stuff.

I can't though. He's not here anymore.
