MORE REPRINT EDITIONS ARRIVE:

Reprints of the September '40 ASTOUNDING and October UNKNOWN have arrived in Australia and are now on sale at most City bookstalls. Another arrival was the thirteenth

issue of TALES OF WONDER with its new standard cover.

The production of the ASTOUNDING cover is not very clear, but we do not think that this was so with all the copies. Some fans have expressed a likening for the variation in the colour shade on the British job, and some a preference to it rather than the American original.

Sydney fans are both glad and annoyed to have discovered that Woolworth's is selling the reprints at 7½d a copy while they have been paying a 1/- each.

The bookstall owners are, however, not to blame for it has been discovered on enquiry that they themselves pay more than this. Woolworth's have apparently bought a very large number and therefore got a special price.
