

Runner-up: Age Book of the Year Award, and Barbara Ramsden Award. **Gerald Murnane**'s richly humorous fantasy/allegory about 'another Australia' — a district known as The Plains, where landowning families on vast estates preserve a distinctive culture, a culture in which nothing is as it appears. Murnane's rich style has been compared with Borges, Calvino and Proust.

In the Heart or in the Head: An Essay in Time Travel
