The Administrators of the 2018 TAFF campaign are pleased to announce that Johan Anglemark of Sweden will be the 2018 TAFF Delegate. He will attend WORLDCON 76, the 76th Annual World Science Fiction Convention to be held in San Jose, California on August 16-20, 2018 (see their website at https://www.worldcon76.org/) and is already planning his travels to additional destinations throughout North America during his trip.

Following his return home, Johan will become the next European administrator of TAFF, and will conduct the 2019 TAFF campaign and election in association with John Purcell.

Still More 2018 TAFF Race Statistics

The Fan Fund Auction and table sales at Follycon (this year's Eastercon) raised additional funds as well, to the tune of £ 993.26 GBP. According to a post-Eastercon summary, most (just over £800) came from the auction, with the remainder from table sales and the casino. The vast majority of these funds were evenly split between TAFF and GUFF.
